The Frank N. Newman Undergraduate Research Fund in Economics was created to enable economics concentrators to go beyond conventional methods of thesis preparation and research and to discover perspectives that encourage innovative, conceptual, and comparative approaches. This fund supports undergraduate students pursuing term- or summer-time research projects in collaboration with faculty members in the Harvard Economics Department.

Eligible projects will result in a paper authored by the faculty member, the student, or both and should address issues related to the federal debt or examine macro-economic policy questions. Awards will be given at the discretion of the Chair of the Department of Economics.
