



## DISSERTATION DELAYED RELEASE REQUEST

An embargo period means the period of the time upon official distribution that the article is not yet openly accessible. When you choose to select an embargo, the full text of your dissertation will be unavailable for download for the limited period of time you select. However, the metadata associated with your work, along with your abstract, will always remain publicly available, whether or not you choose to embargo your work. PhD dissertations are published or otherwise made available for distribution as proof of the candidate's achievement, echoing a traditional European idea that the candidate for a doctorate must make a contribution to knowledge and cannot have a degree for making a discovery that is kept secret. **Embargo periods over two years require additional support from the student's director of graduate studies, please complete the form below and submit to your director of graduate studies for approval.**
