### CATALOGUE OF EXHIBITS

- The Museum is open to the public from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. daily, Sundays and holidays excepted.
- The exhibits are on the second and the third floor.
- The framed photographs are enlargements, and most of them date from the year 1902.
- The following is a general view of the contents of the various cases, with special mention of a few of the more noteworthy objects. The numbers refer to the cases.

## OBJECTS FROM PALESTINE, EGYPT, PHOENICIA, DAMASCUS, AND PERSIA

- Palestine. Costumes, pottery, utensils and implements.
- 2. Palestine. Geological specimens.
- Palestine. Specimens of the flora (seeds, woods, plants), and models of fruits.
- Palestine. Objects in Stone (Tiles from the great mosque at Jerusalem; Tiles from the "Tenth Legion," 1st century A.D.).
- Bedouin objects from Palestine and other lands.
- Ornamental tiles from Damascus;
   Cast of a Greek inscription from the Temple of Herod.

- Sabaean inscriptions (casts); Moslem mortuary stones in the Cufic character, from Cairo.
- Oriental musical instruments; Palmyrene busts.
- Phoenicia. Pottery, and casts of inscriptions.
- Damaseus. Copies of table and Coran box (originals in Cairo); stands for the Coran; brass objects.
   Damaseus. Inlaid work; Nargilehs.
- 13. Egypt. Canopic jar; Flints; Stelae.
- Egypt. Funeral boat; Stelae; Cast of the "Rosetta Stone" inscription.

- Persia. Casts of archers and other royal attendants.
- Damascus and Persia. Armor, vases, and a variety of objects in brass.
- Palestine. Glass vases, pottery, bronzes from tombs in Palestine. About 2000 years of age.
- Palestine and Damascus. Trays, baskets, lamps and models.
- Palestine. Head-dresses and articles of feminine adornment.
- Palestine. Birds, Bedouin objects, apparel.
- Manuscripts and books.
